## Grading

### A. Attendance

2.5 points will be given for each day of full attendance. Maximum 100 pts.

## B. Music Journals

As of the second week we will be listening to music in class. During class, students will write or type their reactions and observations in their music journal. Journals are submitted at the end of class each Friday. If the journal is done in class on the computer, the journal must be sent to the instructor's email as a Microsoft Word attachment immediately <u>before</u> the end of Friday's class. 5 pts will be given for each journal day if complete. Maximum 100 pts.

# C. Playlists

Students explore music and compile their own playlist from each music period we cover in class. Students choose music from the Alexander Street link found within the Playlist Information Module in Canvas. Caution: Do <u>not</u> Google Alexander Street. You <u>must</u> use the link in Canvas or it will not work. All instructions along with the grading rubric are found within the Playlist Information Module. Of course, you can use Alexander Street to access other music as well! Each playlist consisting of <u>five</u> "tracks" or selections completed according to posted instructions is worth a maximum of 25 points. Maximum 150 points.

# D. Discussion Forums

Five forums designed to delight, intrigue, and reflect provide musical "commercial breaks" from subject matter covered in class. Each forum is worth 20 points if complete. Maximum 100 points.

# E. In-class/Inbox Assignments

Throughout the semester, we will be touching on topics in class that I will ask students to explore further. These *in-class assignments* <u>due at the beginning of the next class</u> require a typed 1-2 paragraph response that <u>will include the exact source of information</u>. If it is a website, just copy and paste the website. Do not type the generic Wikipedia. I need to be able to access the source. If it is Wikipedia, then I need the exact page.

I will also send assignments through the Canvas Inbox that will take you to fascinating music topics that will open further one's musical horizons. Each *Inbox assignment* will have a due date and time as part of the Subject line, so keep an eye on the Inbox!

Since every student has different interests, I do not expect everyone to respond to each assignment. The important thing is to complete 15 assignments by the end of the semester to earn full credit. This should be fun! Each assignment is worth 10 points. Maximum 150 points.

# F. Exams

There will be three exams based on the material covered in each section of the course. Practice quizzes in Canvas provide unlimited opportunity for exam preparation. Each exam is worth 100 points. Maximum 300 points.
