LPN to ADN Advanced Placement Option Admission

Thank you for your interest in the New River Community College Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) Program. The Advanced Placement Option (APO) prepares current LPNs for a career as a Registered Nurse (RN). Admission to the ADN program is competitive entry consisting of Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) scores, grade point average (GPA), and ADN pre-requisite courses. Admission and program information is available at www.nr.edu/nursing.

The following requirements must be completed by November 1 prior to the spring semester for which you are applying for admission. Any changes to the application deadline or requirements will be noted on the nursing website. Preference is given to applicants who are residents of NRCC's service region (Floyd, Giles, Montgomery, and Pulaski Counties and the City of Radford).

ENG 111 (English Composition I) with a grade of C or higher
BIO 141 (Human Anatomy and Physiology I) with a grade of C or higher within the last 10 years
BIO 142 (Human Anatomy and Physiology II) with a grade of C or higher within the last 10 years
MTH 130 (Fundamentals of Reasoning) with a grade of C or higher - OR -
Completion of the MTH 130 competency exam with a grade of 80% or higher
(only available to individuals who previously completed a college math course at the MTH 154 level or higher with a grade of C or higher)
PSY 230 (Developmental Psychology) with a grade of C or higher
SDV 101 (Orientation to Health Sciences) or SDV 100 (College Success Skills) with a grade of C or higher
Curricular GPA of 2.5 or higher and in good standing with NRCC
Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) score in the 45 th national percentile or higher
(The TEAS assesses knowledge and skills in English, reading comprehension, math, and science. Priority is given to students who receive the highest TEAS scores. TEAS scores are valid for two years.)

Support – BLS)
Proof of unrestricted LPN licensure
Attendance at an ADN general information session
